

# MINOR OFFICIALS CHECKLIST

For the upcoming club season, all 15U Girl's teams that are scheduled for officiating are expected to arrive promptly and to perform their Minor Official duties to an acceptable level as supervised by the match's First Official/R1 & their team Coaches.

## SECOND REFEREE

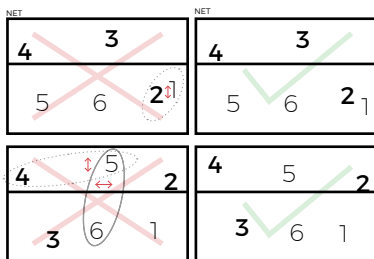
Also called R2/Down Referee. Must be a coach or an athlete that is supervised by a coach. R2s are highly suggested to meet with the R1 prior to match start time to communicate match expectations. R2s must blow their whistle & signal the interruption (diagram) to the R1 before awarding the point together.

Always stand on the receiving and defensive side of the court. Keep your whistle in your mouth.

On defensive side, watch for faults at the net and on the centre line. Make sure to use your whistle.

Understand each player's position on the court. Ensure the setter is standing in the correct position.

For time-outs & substitutions, only whistle when coaches signal to you or when a player enters the substitution zone in front of the 3m line.



Following the R1's whistle to end each rally, always ensure to mirror their signals.

Assist the Scorer & Line Judges in communications with the R1. Everyone works together as a team!

The R1 may need you to help signal in/out/touch calls if you see them first. Confirm with the R1 beforehand.

## LINE JUDGE

Minor officiating team must supply two. Use flags whenever possible.

Be active standing at your corner. You should shift side-to-side to have better views.

Do not follow the ball after an attack. Watch the floor where the ball will generally land for better judgement.



- Be familiar with the Line Judge signals (On References Page).
- When signaling, ensure to make eye contact with the R1.

## SCORER

Minor officiating team must supply two. Scorers must be proficient with the below tasks.

Before the match, record the following on the scoresheet:

1. Match Information (Date/Court#/etc).
2. Rosters for both teams.
3. Coaches' & Captains' signatures (before the match).
4. Results (record after each set).

During the match, perform the following duties:

1. Record rotation line up for both teams.
2. Check that the correct player is serving.
3. Keep a running score (check after each rally).
4. Record Time-outs & Substitutions.
5. Record miscellaneous notes given by R1 and/or R2.

After the match, record the following on the scoresheet:

1. Final results.
2. Coaches' signatures (after the match).

# MINOR OFFICIALS REFERENCES

Minor Officials are highly encouraged to understand the signals and rules associated with each officiating role. It is the responsibility of the Minor Officials and their Coaches to communicate with the match R1 ahead of match start time as to what the R1 requires of each Minor Official. ## REFEREE SIGNALS

R2s must first blow their whistle and signal the interruption (diagram) to the R1, before awarding the point together. R2s can blow their whistles and signal first *only* for the below diagrams marked with a . Other signals are exclusively blown by R1s, and are to be mirrored by R2s

### A team scores a point:

- By landing the ball on the opponent's court
- When the opponent team commits a fault
- When the opponent team receives a penalty



### Served Ball Fails to Pass Over the Net

- Indicate the respective side of the net (R2 mirrors only)



### Ball In

- Point the arm and fingers towards the floor



### Four Hits

- Raise four fingers, spread open



### Winning Sets and the Match

- The first team to score 25 points wins the set
- If tied at 24-24, play continues until a 2 point lead is achieved
- The match is won when a team wins 2 of 3 sets
- In the case of a tie (1-1 or 2-2), the deciding set is played to 15 points



### Delay in Service

- Raise eight fingers, spread open (R2 mirrors only)



### Ball Out

- Raise the forearms vertically, hands open, palms towards the body



### Ball Touched

- Brush with the palm of one hand the fingers of the other, held vertically



### Net Touched by a Player

- Indicate the respective side of the net



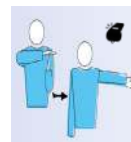
### Penetration into the Opponent's Court or Ball Crossing the Lower Space

- Point to the center line



### Time-out

- Place the palm of one hand over the fingers of the other, held vertically and then indicate the requesting team



### Positional or Rotation Fault

- Make a circular motion with the forefinger



### Reaching Beyond the Net

- Place a hand above the net, palm facing down



### Attack Hit Fault

- Make a downward motion with the forearm, hand open



### Substitution

- Circular motion of the forearms around each other



### Change of Courts

- Raise the forearms front and back and twist them around the body



## LINE JUDGE SIGNALS

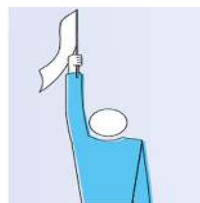
### Ball In

- Point down with flag



### Ball Out

- Raise flag vertically



### Judgment Impossible

- Raise and cross both arms and hands in front of the chest



### Ball Touched

- Raise flag and touch the top with the palm of the free hand



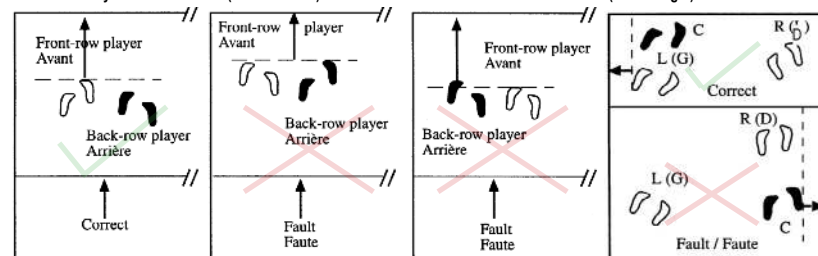
### Ball out or foot fault by any player during service

- Wave flag over the head and point to the antenna or the respective line

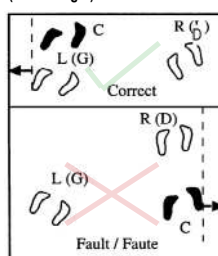

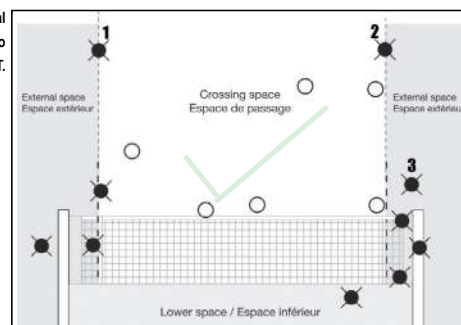
### Positions of Players Prior to Service (Front vs Back)
